Other federal funds are being provided towards the project to meet the 75% cost share threshold. FY15 2014 MN Flood Relief funds will be encumbered for this project.
 - ♦ Contract# EM1-FY15-06 with John Hoffmann for a Grade Stabilization Repair in Cottonwood 16. Cost estimate is \$25,498.67 with cost share approved at \$2,000.00 from Brown SWCD. - ♦ MN Prairie Plan meeting was rescheduled to March 14 which Rathman attended and gave a report to the group. Hahn also attended this meeting and shared comments as well.
- ◆ Stadick attended the MN River Congress event on March 10 in New Ulm and gave a report to the board about the event.
- ♦ Staff, Vogel, Windschitl, Rathman and Stadick staffed the SWCD booth at the Farm Show event March 11-12 and gave feedback to the group about the show.

NEW BUSINESS

- ♦ Commissioner Comments: Commissioner Simonsen gave an overview of current happenings at Brown County. 1) He attended a legislative event last week, March 10-11, and was able to talk with both Senator Dahms and Representative Torkelson about several topics of interest, including buffers, funding, and transportation. 2) Purchases of new equipment (tractor, snowmobile) for the County were approved. 3) No other new items of note, but gave reminder on the sales tax that begins on April 1.
- ◆ Conservation Corps Site Agreement: Goodrich reviewed highlights of the agreement with the Conservation Corps for this year's summer apprentice program. A motion was made by Roiger and seconded by Stadick to sign the agreement with Conservation Corps.

- ◆ 2015 Financial Statements Report: The group reviewed the financials report copies. Krueger reviewed highlights from the Brown SWCD 2015 Financial Statements report and explained the newly required PERA GASB 68 adjustments on these financial reports. The report was submitted to BWSR as required and she is waiting for approval of the report before posting to the district website. An audit will be required and more details to come on that.
- ◆ RIM Reserve 2014 Flood Response: Goodrich advised there is 3.8 million dollars available to 16 counties for RIM easements for areas of land that have documented damage from the 2014 flooding. This equates to about 1 easement of 30 acres per county. No public notice was done by BWSR due to the small number of counties involved, strict requirements, and quick turnaround deadline of March 31. He has a few options in mind for an application, but needs to determine if there is any documented proof of damage from the flood event.
- ◆ FY2018-19 Biennial Budget Request: Goodrich reviewed details from the BBR he has been working on and explained he will be reviewing this with Mark Hiles for approval also. The deadline to submit to BWSR is April 15.
- ◆ District Technician Position: Discussion was held on the status of the hiring process for the District Technician Position. A motion was made by Rathman and seconded by Stadick to delegate the Personnel Committee to continue to handle the hiring process tasks, review/score applications, conduct interviews, and then make a recommendation to the Board for hiring at the next Board meeting in April.
